Waivers

Sign Up for Electronic Updates on Virginia's Waiver Redesign

Initiative An email address has been established by the Virginia Department of Behavioral Health & Developmental Services for providers, families and individuals with disabilities interested in getting electronic updates on Virginia's Waiver Redesign Initiative. If you would like to join this listserve, all you have to do is send an email to waiverupdates@dbhds.virginia.gov and provide your email address in the body of the email (it is not required, but feel free to also briefly note if you or a family member is on the ID or DD Waiver, on a wait list for the ID or DD Waiver, etc). Commonwealth Coordinated Care Demonstration Project (CCC)

Who Does It Affect? Potentially affects Individuals who are enrolled in the Virginia EDCD Waiver and are eligible for Medicare at the same time

(Duel Eligible). Must be over 21, not have another medical plan and be in one of the many demonstration areas.

What is it? A demonstration project "to test a new model for providing Medicare-Medicaid enrollees with a more coordinated, person-centered care experience. Under the Demonstration, Virginia and CMS (Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services) will contract with Medicare-Medicaid Plans (MMPs) to coordinate the delivery of and be accountable for covered Medicare and Medicaid services for participating Medicare-Medicaid enrollees."

<u>Why?</u> "Improving the care experience for low-income seniors and people with disabilities who are Medicare-Medicaid enrollees - sometimes referred to as "dual eligible individuals" - is a priority for CMS. Currently, Medicare-Medicaid enrollees navigate multiple sets of rules, benefits, insurance cards, and providers (Medicare Parts A and B, Part D, and Medicaid).

Many Medicare-Medicaid enrollees suffer from multiple or severe chronic conditions and could benefit from better care."

When & Where? The project is being rolled out in Phases by Enrollment Regions. For a map of affected areas, click here.

Phase 1 Regions include cities in the Tidewater and Central Virginia & Richmond areas.

- Tidewater:
 - Voluntary Enrollment began in March.
 - Automatic Enrollment began May 1.
- Central VA & Richmond:
 - Voluntary Enrollment began in March.
 - Automatic Enrollment began June 1.

Phase 2 Regions include the Northern Virginia, Roanoke and Charlottesville areas.

- Voluntary Enrollment began in May.
- o Automatic Enrollment began August 1.

What does all this mean?

If you choose to enroll, you will be moved from your current model of Feefor-Service to the Capitated Model. See below for explanations of the two:

- Managed Fee-for-Service Model in which a state and CMS enter into an agreement by which the state would be eligible to benefit from savings resulting from initiatives designed to improve quality and reduce costs for both Medicare and Medicaid; and
- Capitated Model in which a state and CMS contract with health plans or other qualified entities that receive a prospective, blended payment to provide enrolled Medicare-Medicaid enrollees with coordinated care.

<u>To "Opt Out" you must call Maximus</u> (855) - 889-5243.

All Waivers Reminders

- If you have stayed in a Hospital more than 30 days or an inpatient rehabilitation center/nursing facility for 1 or more days let your service facilitator know! Your community based approvals have been interrupted and need to be restarted (you are still eligible, no new screening required). An immediate visit with your Service Facilitator upon discharge is needed. Keep us in the loop:-)
- Annually you will get a request from Department of Social Services (DSS) to Update your financial information. Always respond to DSS communications quickly.
- Respite:
 - Is appropriate when there is an unpaid primary caregiver who lives in the home with the individual receiving services.
 - Is a maximum of 480 hours per fiscal year per enrollee. Virginia's fiscal year runs from 7/1/2014-6/30/2015. Track what you've used since 7/1/2014, 480-hours used is what you have left until 6/30/2015.

Maximizing Your Benefits

HIPP For Kids

Don't forget, if you have an employer sponsored insurance and Medicaid, Medicaid may potentially reimburse you for your premium payments via their Health Insurance Premium Payment for Kids programs (HIPP & HIPP For KIDS). For instance:

- A family of four has a monthly premium for insurance via mom's employer of \$300/month.
- One of the children is a Medicaid Waiver recipient.
- Medicaid may reimburse all or a portion of mom's premium payment to assist mom in keeping the family plan so that Medicaid can remain the secondary insurance for the child enrolled in Medicaid.

Free Incontinence, Diabetic and Wound Care Supplies

Don't forget as a Medicaid recipient you are likely eligible for these supplies. ***If you have a child over 3 years old who still needs diapers you are likely eligible for this.*** Contact Home Care Delivered to get started. (800) 867-4412.

Transportation Provision or Reimbursement

Transportation provision or reimbursement for non-emergency Medicaid related transportation is available via LogistiCare for FFS enrolled individuals (MCO enrollees must work with their MCO - Most individuals on waivers are on FFS Medicaid). For FFS enrolled individuals, Logisticare can:

- Coordinate transportation to and from your appointments.
- Or reimburse you/your personal driver for travel to and from Medicaid appointments.

To be reimbursed, travel must be pre-approved. Call LogistiCare to set your initial trips (866) 386-8331. After that, you can utilize their <u>LogistiCare Online System</u>. See their flyer <u>here</u>.

Updated Policy - Non-utilized Attendants

PPL has updated their policy regarding attendants who have not submitted time sheets for a client for 12 months. In these instances PPL will discontinue the association between the aide and the consumer.

Public Partnerships Updates

PPL's recent changes:

- Change to hire packet Attendant must initial each page of the employment agreement.
- Call option for applications (866) 259-3009.
- Attendants who "Hard Fail" Background Checks will no longer be able to employer hop. Some individuals who know they have a background that will hard fail will hop from one new employer to another getting paid for their work until the results of their newest background check are sent to the new employer when they are then forced to stop working. PPL will keep a "Hard-Fail List" and these people will only ever be paid for their work up until the first return of their background check. This is a great idea and improvement.
- Attendant Direct Deposit/Debit Card processing. If the Attendant does NOT return an EFT Form (Direct Deposit) with their Attendant packet, they are automatically enrolled with the Debit Card as an electronic payment method must be chosen upon processing of the Attendant packet.

Virginia Board for People with Disabilities

Since 1992, Virginia Board for People with Disabilities (VBPD) serves as the Developmental Disabilities Planning Council under state and federal Acts. The Board work for the benefit of individuals with DD and their families to identify needs and help develop policies, programs and services that will meet these needs in a manner that respects dignity and independence. It also works to eliminate barriers to full inclusion in all facets of community life. Family members, parents and individuals with disabilities serve of the board for four year terms. The Governor of Virginia appoints board positions.

Assistive Technology Funding through United Cerebral Palsy and Easter Seals

Assistive Technology may be available to some of the residents of Virginia through UCP and Easter Seals UCP NC & VA, Inc. (ESUCP).

*Please Note: We are sorry, Special Assistance is **NOT** available - (through ESUCP NC & VA) -to residents of the following Virginia Counties: Prince Charles, Loudoun, Fairfax, Arlington, and Prince William.

The UCP Bellows Fund is a national program operated by United Cerebral Palsy (UCP) that provides funds to individuals with disabilities for assistive technology equipment. Individuals can apply through their local UCP affiliate: http://nc.eastersealsucp.com/ the affiliate submits an application on behalf of an individual to the UCP national office. Applications are reviewed for funding by the Bellows Committee.

Finding Attendants

A Virginia Statewide Directory is now available for people who would like to become a Consumer-Directed Assistant and for people who need a Consumer-Directed Assistant. People wanting to become assistants can list their skills, availability, location, and contact information. People with disabilities that need assistants can search for a person to work with them that matches their needs.

The Arc of Northern Virginia has put together an incredible document to introduce individuals to consumer direction. Starting on page 8 of the document, there are very valuable insights into finding and managing qualified care providers. (Remember they are located in Northern VA, so the reimbursement rate is only relevant to NVA.)
