- 2. Any medical and/or functional changes.
- 3. Who are your attendants and are they getting paid?
- 4. Have there been any recent hospitalizations?

Waiver Redesign Update

The three new Waivers will be:

- Community Living (CL) Waiver
- Individual and Family Support (IFS) Waiver
- Building Independence (BI) Waiver

The Arc of Virginia's Newsletter also includes other items in the budget to be voted on April 20th by the General Assembly. The state budget is to take effect <u>July 1st.</u> Items such as, Early Intervention, Training Centers, Inclusive Education and more.

It isn't too late to contact your Legislator and make your voice heard.

The Process:

- 1. DBHDS has comments and will assess, add them to the applications, and make changes if needed.
- 2. DBHDS will send application with comments to state.
- 3. State has an unlimited amount of time to ask questions.
- 4. State then has 90 days from their last question to approve/deny application.

5. IF state approves application DBHDS must then write the regs by <u>July 1st.</u>

Maximizing Your Benefits

Federal Employee Health Benefit

Beginning in 2017, all insurance carriers participating in the Federal Employees Health Benefits Program must cover a popular therapy for children with some form of autism, ABA therapy, according to the Office of Personnel Management.

Since 2013, FEHBP insurance carriers have had the option of covering applied behavior analysis, or ABA, as a medical benefit for enrollees' children with disorders on the autism spectrum. OPM told FEHBP providers in a letter dated February 26th that for the 2017 plan year they "may no longer exclude ABA" as a treatment children with Autism. "We expect all carriers to offer clinically appropriate and medically necessary treatment for children diagnosed with ASD," the Federal Employee Health Benefit Letter stated.

Volunteer Income Tax Assistance

IRS-Certified Volunteers offer FREE Tax Preparation, if your household income in 2015 was \$54,000 or less. You could have your taxes prepared and submitted through several area organizations. Trained community volunteers may help with special credits, such as Earned Income Tax Credit, Child Tax Credit, and Credit for the Elderly or the Disabled. In addition to free tax return preparation assistance, most sites also offer free electronic filing (e-filing). Certified volunteers receive training to help prepare basic tax returns in communities across the country. Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) sites are generally located at community and neighborhood centers, libraries, schools, shopping malls, and other convenient locations. Search for a VITA location near you.

Governor's Access Plan (GAP)

There are more than 50,000 uninsured Virginians living with Severe Mental Illness (SMI). The fact that so many uninsured Virginians are affected by mental illness has prompted the creation of the <u>Governor's Access Plan (GAP)</u>. It is a ten step plan that will expand access to care, improve care for veterans and for those with severe mental illness, and enhance value and innovation across the states health system. Over 20,000 individuals suffering from Severe Mental Illness (SMI) in Virginia could be helped by the GAP program.

The Role of the Special Needs Trust When Planning for the Future

- Public Partnerships is Going Green! Effective January 2016, PPL will no longer send Quarterly Service Reports by mail. Your Service Report is now available to view and/or print through the PPL Web Portal. <u>Follow the steps and visual guide</u> to view and/or print your report.
- 2. Effective March 21, 2016, your attendant may be eligible for a <u>Difficulty of Care Income Tax Exclusion</u> for the services they provide to you. If your worker lives in the home where they are providing your services, PPL encourages you to have your worker review important information on our <u>web site</u>. (find links in column on right) A Difficulty of Care Income Tax Exclusion <u>Form</u> must be completed and submitted to PPL if your worker determines they are eligible. Opportunity - 2016 Youth Transitions Fellowship (YTF)

The HSC Foundation, in partnership with the National Council on Independent Living (NCIL), is

now accepting applications for a paid fellowship position with the organizations' disability youth transition and collaboration work. This fellowship is ideal for a person with a disability who has an interest in youth career transitions and employment solutions. The fellowship starts in June 2016, and continues for 15 months. Under the supervision of NCIL's Executive Director, the Youth Transitions Fellow (YTF) will gain exposure to youth programs serving people with disabilities and will have the opportunity to facilitate collaboration among internship, fellowship, and apprenticeship programs based in the Greater Washington, DC area.

- Eligibility: College graduate 26-or-younger who self-identifies as an individual with any type
 of disability is invited to apply. You will not be required to disclose your specific disability;
 however, your <u>application</u> for this program will signify that you consider yourself a person
 with a disability. Please Note: This fellowship is specifically for people with disabilities.
- Completed <u>applications</u> received by NCIL before 5:00 PM EDT, Tuesday, April 26, 2016 will be collected and reviewed by their team.

Finding Attendants

A Virginia Statewide Directory is now available for people who would like to become a Consumer-Directed Assistant and for people who need a Consumer-Directed Assistant. People wanting to become assistants can list their skills, availability, location, and contact information. People with disabilities that need assistants can search for a person to work with them that matches their needs.

The Arc of Northern Virginia has put together an incredible document to introduce individuals to consumer direction. Starting on page 8 of the document, there are very valuable insights into finding and managing qualified care providers. (Remember they are located in Northern VA, so the reimbursement rate is only relevant to NVA.)

Other strategies to find attendants:
